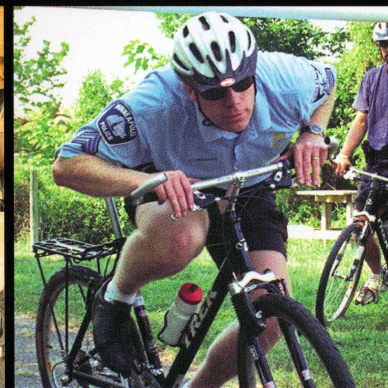
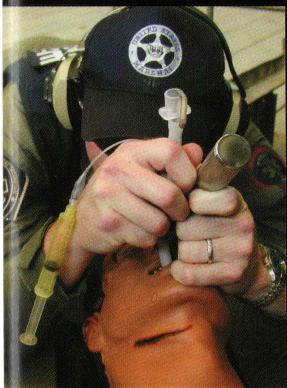

Training Staff

William "Bart" Bartholomew recently retired from the Baltimore County Police Department. He has more than twenty-four years of law enforcement experience including nineteen years as a senior counter sniper assigned to the Special Response Tactical Team. During those years, he has been involved in over 1,400 SWAT operations and high-risk entries. A Marine Corps veteran, long rifle instructor, and competitive shooter, Bart is the founder and coordinator of the Baltimore County Police Department's Counter Sniper School and up to his retirement has trained personnel from over 90 federal, state, and local law enforcement agencies. Bart was the recipient of the 2001 Carlos N Hathcock II Award by the NDIA. He has worked extensively as a private contractor instructing military and law enforcement agencies in sniper and counter terrorism techniques in several foreign countries as well as the U.S.

Michael P. Chin recently retired from the Lakeland Florida Police Department where he served since 1979 as a patrol officer, assigned to the uniform patrol division. For more than fourteen years, Mike was assigned to the SWAT team, the last six as officer-in-charge (OIC). Mike is an adjunct instructor with both

the Polk Community College and the St. Petersburg Junior College, where he instructs in high liability areas such as driving, defensive tactics, firearms, and tactical drug operations.

Tom Taylor recently retired as a Special Agent with the Virginia State Police, Bureau of Criminal Investigation in Fairfax, VA. During his 23-year law enforcement career, he has served in both uniform and non-uniform investigative positions. Tom served five years as a city police officer before joining the Virginia State Police. During his 18-year state police career, he served as a firearms instructor and armorer for both basic recruit school and statewide re-qualification training. Tom was a member of the State Police Tactical Team that handled all high risk search and arrest warrants, barricade situations, fugitive apprehension, and dignitary protection. He also served as Dive Master on the state police dive unit. His final assignment was working on a federal task force in Washington, D.C. Tom has been affiliated with HK for over thirteen years.

Fred Yates is a retired U.S. Army veteran with an extensive special operations background in both the Army Rangers and the Special Forces. His law enforcement experience includes patrol, SRT team leader, defensive tactics, firearms, and tactics instructor. Fred has trained SWAT teams throughout the country and worked with the U.S. Department of Justice as a contract officer in Haiti, Bosnia, and several other countries.

Matt Verardo recently retired from the Prince William County Police Department, Virginia where he served since 1989. His last assignment was in Special Operations with the motorcycle unit. A member of the SWAT team from 1992 to 2001, Matt served as pointman, sniper, training coordinator and entry team leader. He has extensive experience as a defensive tactics instructor both in patrol and SWAT applications. He holds certifications in personal fitness training, ASP, TAZER and defensive tactics.

Adjunct Training Staff

In addition to the full-time staff, the HK team includes a cadre of highly qualified working professionals as adjunct instructors.

David Buchanan joined the ITD Staff in 2000 after serving more than twenty-five years with the Montgomery County Maryland Police Department. During his police career, Dave was assigned to the full-time Tactical Section for four years as an officer and over eight years as the officer-in-charge (OIC). He also served as an executive officer with the Emergency Response Team for four years. Dave participated in and directed more than 900 high-risk entries and over 250 SWAT operations. Additionally, he was the firearms training supervisor and coordinated the Active Shooter training in 1999 for his department and numerous area jurisdictions.

Dr. Dale Carrison is a former Orange County California Deputy Sheriff and FBI Special Agent. He is a board-certified emergency physician and is currently Director of the Emergency Department at University Medical Center in Las Vegas, Nevada. Dr. Carrison was an FBI SWAT team member and is currently a tactical physician for the Las Vegas Police.

Forrest W. Carroll III, "Skip" is president of Carroll & Associates and former staff instructor for the Scotti School. An adjunct instructor with HK since 1995, he is currently responsible for designing and providing specialized driving, VIP protection, and security training programs for corporations, government, law enforcement, and military agencies operating in high-risk areas of the world. Skip has over ten years international experience providing personal protection services for foreign royalty and dignitaries, Fortune 500 executives, VIPs and their families. He has conducted driver training programs on three continents, training people from more than fifteen different countries.

Kevin Cooper is a retired U.S. Marine with more than 19 years of service. His background includes Force Reconnaissance and Diplomatic Security with extensive overseas postings. A Department of State Firearms Instructor, he has a wide range of experience in tactical entry. He is also a certified instructor in chemical munitions, defensive tactics, edged weapons, ballistic shield, and is an instructor trainer for the PR-24.

David Coffey is a professor of criminal at Thomas Nelson Community College in Virginia. He is also an instructor at the Mid-Atlantic Policy Supervisory Institute at Christopher Newport University and teaches for the U.S. Military at the Allied Armed Forces Staff College. He has over 21 years of experience in the law enforcement and criminal justice field, including serving as a police officer and Deputy District Attorney in Los Angeles. He has been a consultant to state and local police departments on a variety of topics; including use of force training, civil liability, execution of high-risk search warrants, and tactical operations. Dave is also the author of several books on law enforcement procedures and training.

Gary Dekinder was a California Highway Patrol officer for 31 years. He has also worked as a motor instructor for the Traffic Institute at Northwestern University. For much of his career, he served as a

Motor Officer, spending eight years as a CHP (California Highway Patrol) Academy Motorcycle Instructor, and five years as supervisor of the CHP Motor Program.

Tom Dresner is a 19 year veteran of the Columbia, Missouri Police Department with more than 16 years experience in tactical operations. Currently he is the commander of the department's SWAT unit. A firearms instructor since 1986, he holds instructor certifications in pistol and less lethal projectiles, and specializes in tactical submachine gun. He also serves as a contract instructor for the U.S. Department of Justice ICITAP program and is on the training committee of the Kansas City area Metro Tactical Officers Association.

Benjamin "Ben" Fravel has more than twenty years experience as a police marksman and team leader with the Prince William County Virginia Police Department. His military background includes special operations and the training and deployment of military snipers. Recently retired from the U.S. Army Special Forces (Reserve), he has trained American and foreign security personnel in counter-terrorism techniques and executive protection.

Garry A. Forman is the Executive Director for the Snowmobile Safety Institute's Law Enforcement Training Division. With more than eighteen years experience in law enforcement, he is recognized as one of the leading experts in tactical Snowmobile/ATV operations, emergency vehicle operations, vehicle dynamics, and cold weather officer survival. He has an extensive background in the development of numerous Snowmobile/ATV operations training programs designed for tactical operations and officer survival.

John A. Fox has worked the past 15 years as a law enforcement officer and instructor in New York State and the City of Poughkeepsie. His background includes positions in patrol, street crimes, and the Columbia County Drug Task Force. Currently, he is the Assistant Commander of the department's Emergency Services Unit. A founding member of the city's police bike unit, he is also the unit supervisor and a long-standing member with seven years service. John is a state and LEBA certified master instructor for Mountain Bike Patrol and former President of the Law Enforcement Bicycle Association (LEBA).

Greg Gillis recently retired after 25 years with the Georgia State Patrol. His most recent assignment was Assistant Tactical Commander of the full time element of the State of Georgia SWAT team. He has also served in the capacity of sniper, team leader, and lead firearms instructor. He previously served as the department's Firearms Coordinator. Greg has extensive experience in executive protection including work with foreign royalty as well as many international protection details. He has also taught executive protection to military and civilian law enforcement.

Larry M. Gochenour, CFI, CFEI has more than 21 years of law enforcement experience with over half of those years as a bomb technician. Larry is the

Commander of the Loudoun County Bomb Squad in Loudoun County, Virginia and handles an ATF Certified Explosion Detection Canine. He is certified as a Firearms and General Instructor by the Virginia Department of Criminal Justice Services. Larry retired from the United States Air National Guard in 1998 with 20 years of service and is the owner of LarGo Fire Specialists.

Lou Ann Hamblin has been in law enforcement since 1990 and works for the patrol division of the Van Buren Township Police Department in South East Michigan. A certified firearms instructor and defensive tactics instructor in a variety of disciplines, she is also certified as a police mountain bike instructor through the International Police Mountain Bike Association (IPMBA). She has instructed nationally in the area of firearms and tactics at all levels of law enforcement and security. Lou Ann is currently enrolled in a master's program in Human Performance Technology and Instructional Design at the University of Michigan.

Dr. Lawrence Heiskell is a SWAT team physician and reserve police officer for the Palm Springs California Police Department. Dr. Heiskell is a residency-trained, board-certified emergency physician with 17 years experience. Dr. Heiskell has lectured and published extensively in the area of tactical emergency medicine. He has served as a SWAT team member for 14 years and has provided emergency medical support for the FBI, DEA and ATF. He is an MP5 Master Instructor.

Jason Mann, a former Marine Corps Scout-Sniper, is a graduate of the Marine Scout-Sniper School and the Scout-Sniper Advanced Course in Quantico, Virginia. Jason currently is the lead weapons instructor and range master for the Santa Monica (California) Police Department. Prior to this assignment, Jason served as a deputy sheriff for the County of Los Angeles for 10 years, where he received the Medal for Bravery. His instructional background includes training thousands of law enforcement and military personnel worldwide.

Patrick O'Laughlin has been an airline pilot for eighteen years and is currently a Captain for a major U.S. airline. He is type-rated in the Boeing 737, DC-9/MD-80, and the Fokker F100. He is also a former U.S. Navy Attack Pilot with twenty years of active and reserve duty including service as an instructor. His involvement in the shooting sports spans several years and includes competitive shooting, as well as attendance at several nationally recognized defensive handgun and firearms training schools. With more than 20 years training in martial arts, he is also a member of the Flight Security Committee- Defensive Tactics Division for his company's ALPA pilot group.

Dr. Dan Olesnick is a SWAT team physician in Northern New Jersey. Dr. Olesnick is residency trained in Internal Medicine and Emergency Medicine. He is the vice chairman of the Department of Emergency Medicine at Christ Hospital. He is also active in Disaster Medicine and Mobile Medical Response System. Dr. Olesnick is a specialist in Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical threats.

Jim Phillips is currently a Patrol Division Commander at the Camden Police Department in New Jersey. He has been a street officer for 30 years. For 26 years he was on the Tactical Force, holding positions as operator, supervisor and commander of the SWAT team. He is widely published in the field of clandestine and exotic weaponry and an expert witness on police use-of force. Jim is a certified instructor in firearms, defensive tactics, impact weapons and crowd control tactics.

Don "Donnie" Pierson has 19 years of law enforcement experience with the Fairfax County Virginia Police Department. Currently serving as a member of the tactical section, he is responsible for team training with the MP5, G36 rifle, and breaching. He is also a firearms and driver training instructor with the Fairfax County Police Academy.

Joseph Riedy has been a member of the Bethlehem Police Department (Pennsylvania) for 15 years. He has worked Patrol, Special Operations, Vice, and is currently assigned as a Sergeant in the Directed Patrol Unit. Joe provides firearms, less-lethal, chemical munitions, defensive tactics and tactical training for the department. A member of the department's Emergency Response Team since 1991 Joe is currently a team leader and supervisor.

Bill Sandman is a 23 year veteran of the West Palm Beach Florida Police Department. He has been a SWAT team member for the past fourteen years. Bill is an adjunct instructor for the Palm Beach Community College Criminal Justice Institute where he teaches defensive tactics, firearms and officer survival. He is currently assigned to the training staff and serves as the range master. Bill has extensive firearms training and holds instructor certifications in pistol, shotgun, submachine gun, and the Sage SL-6 launcher.

Paul Scoskie has been an airline pilot for 25 years, accumulating over 14,000 flight hours. Currently a first officer on trans-Atlantic flights, Paul also served with the Oldham County Sheriff Department in Kentucky. A competition PPC shooter, he owns Practical Shooting Systems (a training company), and has attended a wide variety of law enforcement firearms schools. He has been a member of IALEFI & ALEA since 1993.

Dave Spaulding is a Lieutenant and 25 year veteran of the Montgomery County Ohio Sheriff's Office. He is currently the commander of a joint local, state, and federal drug task force. He has worked in all facets of law enforcement including jail, communications, patrol, evidence collection, investigations, undercover operations, training, and SWAT. Dave is a certified instructor in many disciplines and is an author of numerous published articles and a book. He is also a member of IALEFI, ASLET, IACP, and is a past president of the Ohio Tactical Officer's Association.

Dr. David H. Tang is a SWAT team physician and reserve police officer with the Palm Springs California Police Department. He is a residency-trained, board-certified emergency physician with 20 years experience. Dr. Tang has served as a SWAT team member for 10 years and has provided emergency medical support for the FBI, DEA and ATF. He is an MP5 Master Instructor and also has a background in less lethal weaponry instruction.

Kathleen Vonk has been a police officer in Michigan since 1988. She developed the police cyclist program for the Ann Arbor Police Department and is the currently Vice President of the International Police Mountain Bike Association (IPMBA). One of the designers of IPMBA's elite Advanced Police Cyclist Course, she is also a frequent speaker at professional conferences. Her presentations at international conferences have included officer survival, use of force, realistic training, firearms, police cycling and police-specific fitness. Widely published in a variety of professional journals, she holds a BS in Exercise Physiology and a BA in Criminal Justice.

John H. Zamrok, a decorated Marine Corps Vietnam veteran, retired after 24 years of New Jersey Municipal and State law enforcement service. He served as a SWAT team leader and his years of experience as a law enforcement firearms instructor includes five years as a full-time regional instructor for HK's International Training Division. John is presently New Jersey's State Range Master coordinating all recruit and in-service law enforcement firearms training.

Tactical Submachine Gun

This dynamic, hands-on, physically demanding course is designed for tactical team members or others who conduct building entries and control subjects. Focusing on the utilization of the submachine gun during entries, the tactics and techniques taught are practiced through realistic high-level simulations that will enhance officers' abilities to conduct entries and deploy submachine guns effectively. Beginning with small team concepts and culminating in the employment of a large team making multiple entries, this course also emphasizes dynamic clearing techniques that are used in high-risk warrants and hostage rescue raids. Among the subjects covered are:

- Close quarter battle drills
- Multiple targets
- Low-light firing
- Firing on the move
- Live-fire room clearing
- Team assault techniques
- Use of distraction devices
- Active Countermeasures
- Immediate threat concept
- Practical exercises
- Dynamic entry techniques

HK Submachine Gun Operator

The HK family of submachine guns (MP5 and UMP) are the focus of this course. Whether used by tactical or narcotics teams as a primary entry weapon or as a general-use arm for the vehicle, this comprehensive course covers the operation and employment of the MP5 and the UMP, providing a solid foundation of knowledge. Class instruction not only demonstrates multiple uses in the tactical role, but also clearly defines the intricacies and characteristics of HK submachine guns. By combining the tactical knowledge and instructional expertise of HK instructors with the unique perspective of the manufacturer, students will participate in the most thorough HK submachine gun operators course available. Topics covered include:

- Breakdown & assembly
- Load, unload & stoppages
- Fundamentals of shooting
- Reload drills
- Close quarter battle techniques
- Low-light firing
- Static & moving turns
- Back-up firearm
- Firing on the move
- Multiple targets
- Use of cover
- Controlled automatic fire

Handgun Deployment for the Concealed-Carry Officer



Tuition: \$495 **Duration:** 3 days **Ammunition:** 750 rounds **Special Requirements:** Pistol, concealable holsters (hip, shoulder, ankle, and fanny pack), 3 magazines, jacket, flashlight, baseball style cap, wraparound eye and ear protection

Designed to develop, expand, and improve the firearms-handling abilities of officers who carry a pistol during plainclothes, anti-crime undercover, protection, and narcotics details, as well as techniques the officer who carries a firearm while off-duty.

A vast exposure to concealed-carry options is presented and practiced through extensive live-fire range practice with tactical situation emphasis. Course content includes:

- "Winning" mind-set
- Concealed carry concepts
- Methods of draw and deployment
- Relative positioning
- Shooting from inside a vehicle
- Fundamental shooting techniques
- Practical scenarios
- Man-on-man scenarios

Tactical Survival Shooting



Prerequisite: Pre-test (see note below) **Tuition:** \$795 **Duration:** 5 days **Ammunition:** 2,000 rounds **Special Requirements:** Duty pistol, belt, holster, 3 magazines (5 for single column magazines) flashlight, baseball style cap, wraparound eye and ear protection (long sleeve shirts are recommended)

Dates/Location: February 16–20 Santa Monica, CA

This fast-paced, aggressive shooting course will enhance the skill and the confidence of police officers when the “final alternative” of deadly force must be used to save both police and civilian lives. Survival Shooting teaches officers how to react and deploy their pistol quickly and accurately against an armed perpetrator(s) while maximizing officers available protection. The class uses extensive timed, live-fire drills combined with instruction on both the psychology and physiology of survival shooting. Teaching aids such as remote-controlled paint guns and marking projectile technology are also employed. Not an introductory shooting course, students must pass a demanding live-fire skill evaluation on the first day of the course. Topics include:

- Physiology of survival shooting
- Single & multiple adversaries
- Shooting, reloading and movement from cover
- Position shooting
- Timed fire from the ready position and holster
- Reactive speeds
- Use of marking projectiles
- Use of cover from multiple targets
- Shoot back target systems
- Man-on-man scenarios

***NOTE:** Students must successfully pass a pre-test on the first day of this course to participate—those who fail to meet these standards will not be allowed to continue with the course. Contact HK ITD for more information.

Tactical Pistol



Tuition: \$795 **Duration:** 5 days **Ammunition:** 1,000 rounds **Special Requirements:** Pistol, holster, 3 magazines, tactical gear, body armor, flashlight, baseball style cap, wraparound eye & ear protection (long sleeve shirts are recommended)

Dates/Location: July 26–30 October 11–15 HK Sterling, VA Lakeland, FL

Tactical pistol is a fast-paced, interactive course that covers the role of the pistol as a primary firearm for the tactical officer. The emphasis is on developing tactical and shooting skills that can be applied in real-life situations and specifically concentrates on close quarter battle techniques during building clearing operations.

Live fire entries and high-level simulations are combined with extensive range firing to provide participants with realistic situations to apply their developed skills. Topics include:

- Safety & handling
- Reload & stoppage drills
- Firing positions & barricades
- Drawing & firing techniques
- Use of shields
- Firing on the move
- Low-light firing
- Paired shooting
- Strong & support hand firing
- Multiple targets
- Dynamic clearing techniques
- Shoot back target systems
- Live fire room clearing
- Weapon retention
- Man-on-man scenarios

Police Pistol



Tuition: \$495 **Duration:** 3 days **Ammunition:** 750 rounds **Special Requirements:** Pistol, holster, 3 magazines, flashlight, patrol duty rig, baseball style cap, wraparound eye and ear protection (long sleeve shirts are recommended)

Dates/Location: June 23–25 HK Sterling, VA

This three day, live fire handgun course is designed to provide law enforcement officers with the pistol handling skills needed to effectively deploy their handgun during high-risk encounters. 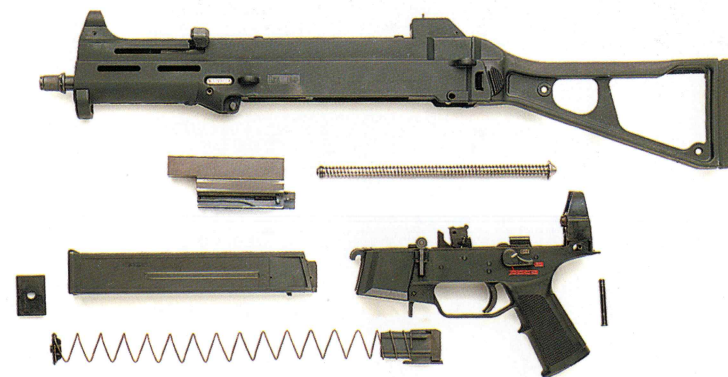

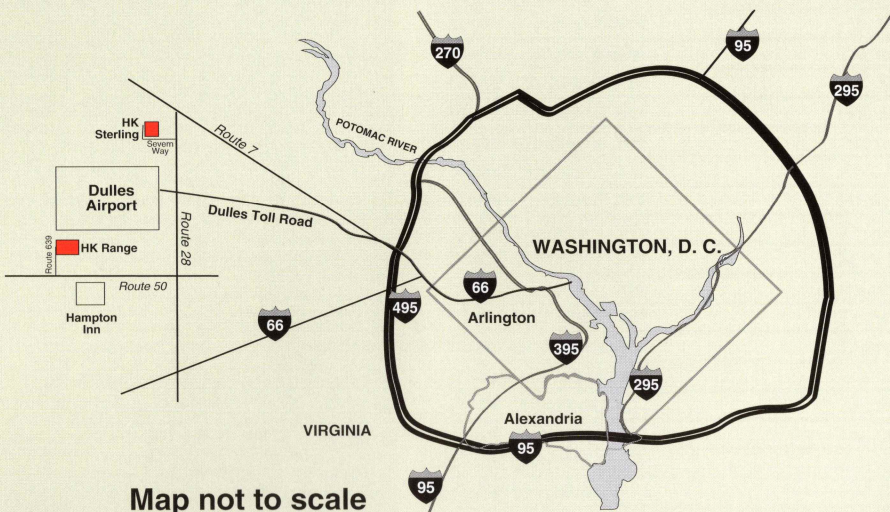

Classes are held at HK-operated facilities in Northern Virginia, located near Washington, D.C., and at convenient locations throughout the country. For more information on joining a scheduled mobile course, or arranging special on-site instruction, contact the Training Division office. All HK training courses combine elements of practical instruction and theory for an innovative and valuable learning experience.

All firearms and tactical courses are restricted to regular and reserve law enforcement officers, federal agents, and military personnel. Qualified civilian security professionals are eligible for executive protection courses. HK training is not limited to static shooting techniques. Many classes involve long hours and physically demanding activities. Each attendee must be physically capable of jogging short distances and able to perform the strenuous exercises common in tactical operations.

Students are not required to bring any firearms, but are advised to wear clothing suitable for indoor and outdoor range use. Ammunition can be purchased from HK stocks. Hotel accommodations, meals and transportation are the responsibility of the student.

Registration

To register for a course, either telephone the Heckler & Koch International Training Division at (703) 450-1900 (extension 293), or complete and mail/fax the registration form included on page 27. A \$100 deposit is required at the time of registration to reserve a course placement. This security deposit is refundable upon cancellation, provided HK is notified at least 30 days prior to the beginning of the course. A full tuition penalty is charged for unattended courses cancelled less than 30 days prior to their start date.

Payment

Tuition must be paid in full prior to attending any course unless specific prior arrangement has been made at the time of registration. Firearms

The HK Training Division can supply all firearms and accessories for use during most classes. Please call the Training Division at least two weeks prior to your scheduled class to make specific arrangements.

Ammunition

Ammunition is not included in the cost of tuition. Students are responsible for providing their own ammunition. If you wish to purchase ammunition from HK, please specify your ammunition needs when registering or by calling at least two weeks prior to your scheduled class.

NOTE: Reloaded, cast lead, and alloy case ammunition is not recommended for use with HK firearms and will not be allowed for use with the HK Training Division firearms. Please direct any questions regarding this issue to the Training Division.

Firearm Purchase

Each student successfully completing an HK Training Division course will be given the opportunity to buy an HK firearm for personal use at a special price.

Dress

Casual attire is recommended for all range and classroom instruction. Clothing suitable for adverse weather conditions is also advised for all range work. For all tactical classes, we strongly urge that you bring the equipment that you would wear and carry in an operational situation. This ensures a more realistic training experience. Full wraparound eye protection, ear protection, and hat are mandatory for all firearms courses and are the student's responsibility.
